

Pawhuska and Hominy

Our first stop of the morning will be in Hominy, OK. Home to the **Fred Drummond Home** and the **Murals of Cha Tullis**.

Hominy, Oklahoma, is a place where oil and cattle industries blend with Native American influence to create a cultural heritage that is truly unique.

With origins beginning in 1886 as a trading post, the future site of Hominy would eventually get its namesake after an Osage Indian chief of the era. Steeped in history, Hominy was once home to the Hominy Indians Professional Football Team, a group of primarily Native American players who beat the New York Giants in an exhibition in 1927.

Visit the **Frederick Drummond Home**, ancestor of Ladd Drummond. *The Drummond Home is a three-story Victorian home built by turn-of-the-century business leader and cattleman/rancher Frederick Drummond and his wife Adeline Gentner.*

Tour the fascinating murals of Hominy.. *If we are lucky we might talk the artist Cha Tullis into hopping on board to narrate.*

Visit Cha's shop before a tasty, lite, lunch... keeping in mind the elegant dinner in store for us this evening.

Afternoon depart for Pawhuska...*Once a quiet small town , is now The place to be in Oklahoma these days. Shop to your hearts content at the Merc and other shops in the downtown area. (They are adding new ones all the time.)*

Pawhuska... Deep in the heart of Osage County, explore a spirited mix of American Indian and western culture in this historic town. See the romance of Pawhuska's history with 86 of 98 downtown buildings on the National Register of Historic Places. Established in 1872, the town's history is interwoven with that of the Osage Nation, headquartered in Pawhuska.

Early afternoon – Dinner time. No standing in line for dinner. The only meal the Merc will take reservations for. We are in for an elegant four course meal. ENJOY

Early evening return to OKC eager to share all the “new” things that Pawhuska and Hominy have to offer and planning a return trip.
