


San Antonio by AMTRAK

March 29 OKC to San Antonio, TX

Texas bound; our morning begins aboard the Heartland Flyer AMTRAK Train. Enjoy the scenery as we travel off the beaten path to Fort Worth, Texas - Here we will enjoy lunch on our own before continuing our train travel on the **Texas Eagle** to San Antonio. Enjoy a continental breakfast before our City tour. Our stops will include the **Alamo**, *one of five missions established by Spanish Catholics between 1718 and 1731. The Alamo played a significant role on Texas history with the battle in 1836.* **Lunch on your own.** Our afternoon will be spent in the heart of San Antonio where you'll find the **River Walk** – *a cobblestone pathway that runs along the banks of the San Antonio River downtown. A respite from the bustle of downtown, the River Walk is a perfect place for strolling and some leisurely time, eating and shopping.* Dinner included at **Tower of America** – *this revolving restaurant is perched high on the 750-foot tower that is the focal point of Hemisfair Park. Its observation deck offers an expansive overview of San Antonio*

March 31 San Antonio, TX

Breakfast included at the hotel. Today we'll enjoy a leisure morning as we visit some interesting sites in San Antonio. The **Guenther House and Pioneer Flour Mill** will be our first stop of the day. *The home was originally built as a private residence in 1859 by Pioneer Flour Mills founder Carl Hilmar Guenther. It is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. In 1972 it became a contributing structure of the King William Historic District.*

Included lunch at Mi Tierra Restaurant and Bakery

Following lunch enjoy an afternoon full of Mexican culture as we take advantage of some free time at the El Mercado Market Square. Our final tour will conclude at the **SAS Shoe Factory**. April 1 Day trip to Fredericksburg. CB , D

Our morning drive finds us in Texas Hill Country in the middle of Bluebonnet blooming. Arrive in Fredericksburg in time to visit the **Wildseed Farm** and the **National Museum of the Pacific War and Admiral Nimitz Museum.**

Wildseed Farm - *Nationals largest working Wildflower Farm with over 200 acres in Fredericksburg alone.*

Museum of the Pacific War - *The National Museum of the Pacific War is located in Fredericksburg, Texas, the boyhood home of Fleet Admiral Chester W. Nimitz. Nimitz served as CinCPAC, Commander in Chief, United States Pacific Fleet and was soon afterward named Commander in Chief, Pacific Ocean Areas during World War II. The six-acre site includes the Admiral Nimitz Museum which is housed in the old Nimitz Hotel and tells the story of Nimitz beginning with his life as a young boy through his naval career as well as the evolution of the old hotel.*

Late afternoon return to San Antonio for our final evening in Texas. Included dinner.

April 2 San Antonio to Oklahoma City CB

AMTRAK is waiting at the station for our return trip to Oklahoma.
